Dan Stauffer introduced our speaker, Bill Flagg, a former classmate of Dan's at Princeton. Bill has spent over 45 years as a History teacher. He showed a picture of a portrait of his Patriot Ancestor, painted by the famous colonial artist, John Trumbull. Bill's topic was "Washington's Generals." He focused on General Nathanael Greene, one of the Revolution's youngest general officers, and the admitted favorite General of George Washington himself. Greene's charismatic leadership in the southern campaign led to the capitulation of Lord Cornwallis at Yorktown, even though Greene lost most of the battles he ever fought. His gorilla style of fighting meant he could wear

down his opponents who constantly outnumbered his troops. Many felt that Greene could have become president, but for his sudden and untimely death.

Meeting was closed at 1p.m. with the SAR Recessional and closing prayer by Chaplain Kirkland.
