

Texas SAR Arlington Chapter Meeting Minutes November 12, 2022

The November 12, 2022, meeting was held at Southern Recipes Grill, 2715 N. Collins Street, Arlington, Texas. Members and guests gathered at 8:30 a.m. for fellowship and breakfast.

- I. President Dan Hamilton welcomed attendees and opened the meeting for Chapter business at approximately 9:00 a.m.
- II. Chaplain Bob Wehr gave the invocation.
- III. Sergeant-at-Arms Richard Martin led the pledges to the U.S. Flag, Texas Flag and the Sons of the American Revolution Flag.
- IV. President Hamilton recognized Past Chapter Presidents and greeted our prospective members and guests.
- V. Comments of the Day: Compatriot Anderson updated the Chapter on Compatriot Dick Lee's health. Dick has moved to a location near his daughter and would welcome phone calls.
- VI. Historical Recap: President Hamilton provided a brief introduction about Fort Laurens, Ohio. He then called on Compatriot Bill Covington, who provided an enlightening presentation on Fort Laurens. Of significance is that it is the only Revolutionary Fort within the borders of Ohio and was occupied for 9 months. Also, Fort Laurens is one of three locations of a Revolutionary War Tomb of an Unknown Soldier.
- VII. In honor of Veterans Day, a Patriot Roll Call was held.
- VIII. Officer and Committee Reports:
 - A. Treasure: Compatriot Richard Coffee reported that during the two statement periods from September 8 to November 4 the bank balance decreased by \$92.50 for SAR Badges and paper.
 - B. Secretary: Compatriot David Friels reporting for Compatriot Goodman reminded the Chapter that the minutes from October have been posted on the chapter website. The floor was opened for comments on the minutes. There being no comments, Compatriot James Gibson moved that the minutes be accepted as posted, the motion was seconded by Compatriot Friels, and approved by the Chapter.
