Ray was born on February 8, 1936, in Chicago, Illinois to Jacob Luz/Louis De Vries and Milly Rosey aka Rose Millie Newberry.

Ray entered the United States Air Force on Oct 3, 1955. He married his high school sweetheart, Nancy Katherine Reberg, on September 23, 1956 in Chicago, Illinois. The marriage produced two sons. Mark Edward De Vries, July 14, 1957 at Forbes Air Force Base, Topeka, Kansas and David Ray De Vries, Aug 29, 1958 at Kindley Air Force Base, Bermuda.
