



Mr. Lowe led off with introductory comments on his career as an *Archivist* for a number of Presidential libraries, museums, as well as national governmental and historical repositories. He became Bush's first appointment (4/2009) after the President left office. He also stated that he has enjoyed an extensive research on the "Founding Fathers," and he appreciates the SAR's educational purpose and patriotic participation to maintain our historical freedom.



He added, that when he first met the President and Mrs. Bush, it was at the White House. Speak about **"pressure packed interviews, the Oval Office is right up there."** The National Archives worked with the White House to move the records of the President (over 70 million pieces of paper, photos, documents & historical memorabilia) –after his administration ended – into the designated museum/library temporary-holding facility.

At the conclusion of his very informative presentation, he mentioned that he was investigating the possibility of our Society participating in the dedication Grand Opening of the Library in April of 2013. President Northcraft presented him a thank you gift.
