
Vice President Robert Kittrell, again stepped in for President



Since the <u>Treasurer</u> had to leave early, Compatriot Kittrell presented the 2018 Chapter Budget (\$ 8,336) for members to discuss and vote on. With no discussion advanced, a motion and second were made and approval vote recorded. As of 11/30/17 we are \$50 over this year's total budget (\$ 8,236). Total "Gala" Income/Expense statement is yet to be resolved.

State Color Guard Commander Bill Watts, reported that the annual Medal of Honor Parade in Gainsville, Texas and being considered as a national event by NSSAR, is scheduled for the same date (4/7/18) as our TXSSAR Conference. Thus, we are looking for a delegation of guardsmen to participate in the parade and who don't plan to attend conference meetings scheduled for Saturday morning. <u>Registrar</u> noted that the Chapter has twelve applicants at national and a couple more on the way. <u>Membership</u> reported that the Chapter Compatriots currently total 260 and that we need to be sure all have paid this year's dues before January 31st. <u>Historian</u> said he has the yearend scrapbook almost complete as soon as the annual report is included. He requested that members help out the newly elected Historian by providing photos and recorded events for the coming year. Committee Chairman of the
