### **OCTOBER DALLAS CHAPTER MEETING MINUTES**

President Van Fossen called the meeting to order at 9:00 am and Brent Harshman gave the Invocation. The meeting was presented a special opening film from cable TV station RFD. The film was the Pledge of Allegiance and the spoken verses of America the Beautiful. Van Fossen then led the Pledge to the Texas Flag and the SAR.

Van Fossen welcomed everyone to the meeting and introduced 1<sup>st</sup> Vice President Mark Harrison. Harrison introduced the morning speaker, Larry Collins from the McKinney Chapter. Larry is a 40 year History teacher at the high school and college level, now retired. His talk was described as a little history of the Declaration of Independence "It actually went into the lives of the people who were responsible for getting our Declaration written and approved.

He discussed the Committee of Five responsible for drafting the original document as appointed by the 2<sup>nd</sup> Continental Congress President, John Handcock ...John Adams of Massachusetts, Ben Franklin of Pennsylvania, Roger Sherman of Connecticut Robert Livingston of New York and Thomas Jefferson of Virginia (the man selected to actually write the document). Larry told many little know stories about each committee member and continued to cover the events leading up to the actual date of approval by the Congress (June 28<sup>th</sup>, 1776) the first signature on the document ( John Handcock – July 2<sup>nd</sup>, 1776) and the official announcement to the public (July 4<sup>th</sup>, 1776). It took until August 2<sup>nd</sup>, 1776 for all 53 members of Congress to finally get each of their signatures completed.

Larry had a great amount of information and detail that many of us had not heard before. He also read from a book he used during his instructional days entitled "Our Lives, Our Fortunes, and Our Sacred Honor" by Paul Harvey.

Van Fossen thanked Larry for his presentation and then introduced SAR State President Drake Peddie .Peddie explained that since the State email distribution system- dada – had been down for a few days, he would give us an update on the State of the State:

- 1. There will be no face-to-face meetings at the State level for the rest of the year.
- Although the Fall BOM Meeting scheduled for 11/12-11/14 had been cancelled, a ZOOM BOM Meeting with ZOOM committee meetings during the same week is now planned. Registration information and schedules will be forth coming
- 3. 2021 dues statements are being sent next week and the on-line dues statements have been available since 9/12, but could not be announced due to the email problem. He urged all of us to get our dues payments in by 12/31/2020. Any dues payment received after 1/31/2021 will be considered delinquent and will cause you to be dropped by National. This will cause a Reinstatement Form and an extra fee.
