Bill Covington is a retired public school teacher having spent 31 years in the classroom where he taught Social Studies and English as a Second Language (ESL). For the last 13 years he was an instructor of Dual Credit US History, World History, and Government/Economics at



Waxahachie Global High School in Waxahachie, Texas.

Concurrently, he served as an adjunct instructor of Western Civilization, US History, Texas History, and World History at Navarro College located in Waxahachie.

Bill was the TXDAR State Winner of the 2017 Outstanding Teacher of US History Award.

Bill's topic for our meeting is

"The Bad Girls of the American Revolution."

Abigail Adams wrote urging her husband her husband John Adams to "remember the ladies" when forming the new laws of the republic.

In 1776 Abigail inoculated herself and her children against smallpox. She also took care of the family farm while John was away.

John wrote to her, "I know not what would become of me, and mine, if I had not such a Friend to take Care of my Interests in my absence," -1777.

Martha Washington followed her husband on his campaigns during the Revolutionary War. She was at his side and when away she wrote to him.

When her husband died she was asked to publish her letters to George. She decided they were between husband and wife and burned them rather than have them published.



Nancy Ann Morgan Hart a Georgia frontierswoman and staunch Patriot became a legend for her courageous stand against Loyalists.

Represented in this painting from National Geographic depicts Nancy defending herself against a group of Loyalists who barged into her home.

She captured them and held them captive until help arrived to take them away.
