Introduction of our morning Speaker – Tom Van Fossen

Bill Covington, Arlington Chapter and TXSSAR 1st Vice-President & Historian

His topic today is 18th Century Origins of the Russia – Ukraine Conflict



Winston Churchill said, "I cannot forecast to you the action of Russia. It is a riddle, wrapped in a mystery, inside an enigma; but perhaps there is a key. That key is Russian national interest."

Russia is so vast and looked at China for examples of how to govern and create their culture. In the 18th century Peter the Great and Catherin the Great began looking at the west and began creating the current Russia.

Peter realized that to be great you needed two things; have a strong military and keep power from the nobility. Thus he began building the military and began a series of laws to keep power out of the hands of the nobility.

He also realized that Russia needed an ice free port. He began a series of wars to gain a port.

Catherin began looking south towards the Black Sea. She also believed that the Russia needed a Navy. She also codified the law so punishment was directed towards all people without regards to nobility rank. She also set up a table of rank in the military taking away the ability of the nobility to become officers without any qualifications.

She began to look towards the Ukraine and hired John Paul Jones to fight for her.

All Russian leaders have looked to their past. They always try to be a better leader than the leaders of the past. That means a new leader will look to the past and try to make Russia great.




