



Alan^Prather not only made the presentation on the Connecticut flag, but also was a door prize winner later.

Titled "Robert E. Lee & Young Rider", the artist who designed and created it was < Alexander Phimister Procter,

With the recent removal of the beautiful and valuable statue off its pedestal, a grass roots effort has been established by citizens to return it to Lee Park. Warren related why this group, who know the true history of the General and his service to Texas, feel so strongly that the public should again enjoy its display at the original location.

The \$50,000.00 Sculpture (that had no markings or reference to Confederacy or slavery) was dedicated in 1936 by known as "The Buckskin Sculptor" President Franklin D. Roosevelt.

Compatriot **Johnson** emphasized that individuals responsible for the crusade to remove the sculpture probably only tied Lee to the Civil War era, and not the facts of his 32 year stellar military career in the United States Army, and many years of dedicated protection


service to **TEXAS** as Commander of the 2nd Calvary- guarding against vicious Indian attacks & raiding bandits

comings from Mexico. Even though Warren presented far more details of why it was WRONG to remove the statue, he definitely left his audience with a wealth of facts on Lee's devotion to his country heretoforth not normally considered in history.
