

Minutes for Chapter Meeting August 12, 2023 Major K. M. Van Zandt Chapter #6, Texas SAR

9:00 a.m.

President Bobby Gresham called the meeting to order.

- Chaplain Ralph Smith offered the invocation.
- **President Gresham** led the pledge to the flag of the United States, the pledge to the flag of the State of Texas, and the pledge to the SAR.
- **Past President Ron Turner** welcomed the members and guests which included Joy Leftwich, Lauren Sheppard, prospective members Scott Stoddard, Greg Riffel.
- President Gresham turned the podium over to Vice President Kevin Shellman who introduced Compatriot Vann Cunningham for a presentation of the top ten list of facts about the American Revolutionary War. 10. Bloodiest battle was Breed's Hill (Bunker Hill engagement) with 1,000 British killed and 400 colonists killed. 9. Lafayette was made Major General at 19 and coordinated French forces at Yorktown which outnumbered the American troops. 8. Spying was urged by George Washington and personally oversaw the Culper Spy ring who used invisible ink. 7. John Paul was wanted for two murders and added the surname Jones after he moved to America. John Paul Jones attacked a British port in Ireland and tried to kidnap a Scottish Earl to trade for Americans impressed in the British Navy. 6. Paul Revere was a silversmith who made dentures and first used forensic dentistry to identify a body. 5. Sybil Ludington was the 16year-old daughter of Colonel Henry Ludington who made an all-night horseback ride 40 miles to notify militia forces in neighboring towns after the burning of Danbury, Connecticut by British troops. 4. Nowhere in the Declaration of Independence is the word "Independence" used. It does mention "free and independent States". Only one person signed on July 4. John Hancock. 3. Daughters of Liberty tarred and feathered people with molasses and flowers instead of hot tar and feathers. 2. Deborah Sampson disguised herself as a man named Robert Shurtleff and joined the Fourth Massachusetts Regiment. She was discovered during a hospital stay, received an honorable discharge and was granted a pension. 1. The Patriot Army was ordered to undergo variolation by George Washington to obtain immunity from smallpox. Men were infected with live smallpox and spent a month recovering but were now immune.

- **President Gresham** asked for a motion to adjourn which was made and approved.
