Greetings Compatriots,

Winter is upon us, not quite yet, but the temperatures which we have experienced since October are a signal that we may have a cold winter. Although it doesn't actually begin until the Winter solstice on the 21st, it is making its presence known.

It is interesting that Christopher Columbus found the Caribbean Island of Hispaniola in December 1492. It became the nations of Haiti and the Dominican Republic. Also, President James Monroe announced the "Monroe Doctrine" notifying the world that the Americas were closed to further colonization and that any attempt on their part to extend their empires would be a form of aggression. This "Doctrine" was used as late as 1965 by President John F. Kennedy to quench the Cuban Missile crisis.

Many famous persons such as Presidents Martin Van Buren and Woodrow Wilson, General George Custer (of the Little Bighorn), Eli Whitney, Emily Dickinson, Nostradamus, Isaac Newton, "Kit" Carson, Louis Pasteur, Rudyard Kipling, and Clara Barton (who founded the American Red Cross) were born in December. President George Washington died in December 1799.

The first phonograph and the electric incandescent lamp were both demonstrated first in December. The Boston Tea Party occurred in December, and the Treaty of Ghent was signed in December, officially ending the War of 1812. General Washington crossed the Delaware and overpowered the Hessians at Trenton in December. The Stars and Stripes flag was raised over New Orleans in December 1803, as the United States took formal possession of the territory of Louisiana, increasing her size by 885,000 square miles.

Imperial Japanese forces attacked Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, on 7 December 1941. Proclaimed a Day of Infamy by President Roosevelt, it marked the beginning of World War II in the Pacific.

THIS MONTH DURING THE REVOLUTIONARY WAR (1781-1783):

In December of 1781, after the Battle of Eutaw Springs, Nathanael Greene departed the area. British forces are now commanded by Major John Doyle who takes over from a wounded Alexander Stewart. Greene launches an assault at Dorchester, South Carolina, located 15 miles northwest of Charleston and defended by 850 men. The British fail to realize that Greene has only 400 men under his command and hastily retreat to Charleston after destroying what they are unable to carry with them. British forces are so concerned about a Patriot attack upon the city that they take the extraordinary step of arming black slaves.

British troops commanded by Major James Henry Craig are posted at John's Island, outside of Charleston, after they evacuate Wilmington, North Carolina. Henry Lee's intricate plan of assault is aborted when a column led by Major James Hamilton arrives too late and is unable to cross the Wapoo River, which was only fordable once or twice a month.

In December of 1782, no significant events occurred.

In December of 1783, General Washington bids farewell to his officers during an address at Fraunces Tavern in New York City on December 4th.

On December 23rd, Washington resigns as commander in chief of the Continental Army and retires to his home at Mount Vernon.

The supreme court of Massachusetts declares that the 1780 state constitution abolished slavery by stating that all men were "born free and equal."

The first map of the United States is produced.

Boston Magazine begins publication.

Noah Webster publishes the American Spelling Book and A Grammatical Institute of the English Language in an effort to standardize the American language.

The Empress of China is the first U.S.-flagged ship to visit China.

Harvard Medical School opens.

A postwar depression begins.

Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl Veteran's Village has been presented by American Red Cross for the past 4 years. The 17th edition of the Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl will be played on Saturday, Jan. 4, 2020, with kickoff set for 10:30 a.m. at TCU's Amon G. Carter Stadium in Fort Worth, Texas, on ESPN. The game is slated to feature schools from the Mountain West Conference and Big Ten Conference.

The Veteran's Village is a place for veterans (and all fans) to gather before the game and enjoy a day in their honor. The village will be set up in TCU's Parking Lot 3 on the north side of TCU's Amon G. Carter Stadium. It is open from 7:30 am until 10:30 am.

Maj. K.M. Van Zandt Chapter has supported our veterans by helping staff a booth in the village for several years. We join other SAR and DAR chapters in this worthwhile event. Members hand out Flags of the USA, candies, information about our organizations, etc. SAR members come dressed in historical uniforms. SANTA & SOLDIERS VETERANS DAY PARADE

On Saturday, November 9th, Secretary Ron Turner pulled the chapter trailer for the Captain Nathaniel Mills Chapter DAR in the Santa & Soldiers Veterans Day Parade in Hurst, Texas.

Ron assisted the ladies in presenting the Vietnam Commemorative Pin to four Vietnam Veterans who were riding on the trailer next to our trailer in the assembly area.









The first map of the United States drawn and printed in America by an American was, until a few years ago, hardly known at all. Only seven original copies exist, and the best preserved is now on display for the first time, as the centerpiece of "Mapping a New Nation," an exhibition at the Library of Congress. Printed by Abel Buell, an engraver from Connecticut, in March 1784—six months after the Treaty of Paris—the map relied so heavily on published sources that it contained no original cartographic material. But Buell made sure that his fanciful compilation reflected his politics. Several states, looking hungrily toward French and Spanish possessions on the continent, extend west of the Mississippi River—"Manifest Destiny for the 18th century," says Edward Redmond, the library's curator of geography and maps. In a flourish, Buell banished the word "New" from a number of place names, including New Orleans and New Hampshire. Buell's skills were diverse. An inventor and metalsmith, at 21 he was arrested for counterfeiting. As a part of his sentence, the tip of his ear was cropped off, and he lived the rest of his life with a "C" branded onto his forehead.

Robert Goode, Jr.'s ancestor was Jacob Minor, born in 1761 in VA and died in 1836 in KY. Jacob Minor served as a private in the VA Continental Line.

New members who were not able to attend were: Kedron Woodworth, Robert Goode, III, and Daniel Goode.
