REMEMBER the Fallen. . . HONOR those who Serve. . . TEACH our children the value of Freedom.





	George Roebuck, Jr., was born 15 Mar 1757 in Orange County, VA. He was the son of George Roebuck, Sr. and his wife Mary Warren, He married Levina Bobo sometime in 1781 in Spartanburg, SC. She was born in 1768 and died in 1849.
	They were the parents of 13 children: Benjamin (1782), Rhesa, Sarah, Polly, John (1800), George III, Sampson, Catherine, Raleigh, John, Jeremiah (ca1804), Elizabeth, Nancy, and Frances (ca1805). All the children were born between 1782 and 1805.
	George Jr. enlisted in 1775 in Orange Co., VA, as a common soldier in the Continental Line under Capt. Henry Dixon's Co. and Col. Nash's 1 st Regiment. After he moved to Spartanburg Co., SC, he volunteered in units to fight the Cherokee Indians. He also served under Capt. William Smith, Col. Hammond, and General Williamson. Between 1780 to 1782, he served as a Captain under Maj. John Ford and his brother Col. Benjamin Roebuck in Roebuck's Battalion of Spartan Regiment. In 1782, he also served as a Captain in the 2 nd Spartan Regiment.
	He fought in several battles or skirmishes: Musgrove's Mill, Kings Mountain, Blackstocks, and Cowpens.
	George Jr. died 17 May 1848 in Spartanburg County, South Carolina, and lies in an unmarked grave on the family plantation along the Tyger River outside Roebuck, South Carolina.

PROGRAM CHAIRMAN NEEDED


