

PATRIOT RESEARCH SYSTEM PROJECT UPDATE

Chapter President Ron Turner is a volunteer assisting with adding lineage from chapter members approved applications and updating Patriot information to the Patriot Research System (PRS). As of September 30th, PRS data reflects the Texas Society with a total of 11,482 applications, 10,595 are linked to the Patriot, and 5,576 have complete lineage available to a researcher. The Maj. K.M. Van Zandt Chapter has a total of 445 applications, 335 are linked to the Patriot, and 271 have complete lineage available to a researcher. The goal is to have 100% of applications in the PRS system linked to the Patriot and providing complete lineage from the application.


Have you visited the PRS lately? If not, check out the updates below.

First, the Patriot Search Results screen includes icons as denoted in the legend below the list of Patriot records.




Click on the Patriot number to view the **Patriot Detail Screen** shown below. There are three tabs: Patriot Detail, Grave Detail, and Biography. Each of these are separate projects under the PRS umbrella. In the upper right corner is the **DAR Ancestor Number** if the Patriot is registered in their database. At the bottom of the screen is a list of all SAR members who have approved Applications (Regular or Supplemental) for the Patriot.

In the **View Application Detail** column, the **blue tablet** indicates you can view the detail from the member's Record Copy. The **red X** indicates the Record Copy detail is not available for viewing. If the Record Copy is available for purchase, select the green **Click to Purchase** button.



The screen capture below is a partial result you see when you click on the Tablet icon in the **View Application Detail** column. Due to privacy issues, you will not see any information on generations one, two, or three. Beginning with generation four, you will see the information input from the member's Record Copy. You can also purchase a copy of the Record Copy from this screen.

Be sure to access the PRS system and do some exploring to familiarize yourself with the content of the **Patriot Research System**.





SPIES, PATRIOTS, AND TRAITORS: AMERICAN INTELLIGENCE IN THE REVOLUTIONARY WAR

The Ideological Origins of the American Revolution, awarded both the Pulitzer and the Bancroft prizes, has become a classic of American historical literature. Hailed at its first appearance as "the most brilliant study of the meaning of the Revolution to appear in a generation," it was enlarged in a second edition to include the na-

tionwide debate on the ratification of the Constitution, hence exploring not only the Founders' initial hopes and aspirations but also their struggle to implement their ideas in constructing the national government.

Now, in a new preface, Bernard Bailyn reconsiders salient features of the book and isolates the Founders' profound concern with power. In pamphlets, letters, newspapers, and sermons they returned again and again to the problem of the uses and misuses of power—the great benefits of power when gained and used by

popular consent and the political and social devastation when acquired by those who seize it by force or other means and use it for their personal benefit.

This fiftieth anniversary edition will be welcomed by readers familiar with Bailyn's book, and it will introduce a new generation to a work that remains required reading for anyone seeking to understand the nation's historical roots.

Captain Richard Norman Nelson, USN (Ret.) of Keller, TX, died on Sunday, September 27, 2020 at age 79. Rich

was born in Chicago, IL, on November 2, 1940, to Hans Peter and Margaret Nelson. Rich was a Navy veteran, qualified in submarines, who served his country for 35 years, in both active and reserve duty. As an Engineering Duty Officer, he reported to the Navy's Division of Naval Reactors under Admiral H. G. Rickover. Military decorations include two Meritorious Service Medals, Navy Marine Corps Commendation Medand Recruiting Gold Wreath.

Rich attended Purdue University and received a bachelor's degree with Highest Distinction and master's degree in

Mechanical Engineering. He received his Juris Doctor degree from George Washington University. Formerly, Rich was corporate counsel for Elbit Systems of America: EFW, Inc. in Fort Worth, TX.

Rich was a Life Member of the Naval Reserve Association and Navy League, member of the Reserve Officer Association, American Society of Naval Engineers, Naval Institute, Naval Order, the American Bar Association, National Society of the Sons of the American Revolution, and, most proudly, the US Submarine Veterans (USSVI), Fort Worth and Dallas Bases.

Rich was a violinist with the Northeast Orchestra, including a time as concert master. He had a love of music and performed in many community, theatre, and church orchestras throughout his life.

Rich is survived by his devoted wife of 57 years and dance partner, Bonnie Nelson, daughter Kimberly Nelson of Centreville, VA, daughter and son-in-law Amy and Harold Mylius of Liberty Township, OH, grandchildren Austin Figueroa, Rebecca Figueroa, Elaine Mylius, Bennett Mylius, Bradley Mylius, as well as treasured brother, fishing and golf partner, Dr. Allan Nelson (Gayle) of Pentwater, MI.

Burial with full military honors will be held at Arlington National Cemetery at a later date.






