Greetings Compatriots,

This will be my first year to volunteer and I am looking forward to it.



From what I know from others, the opportunity to talk about the SAR and recruit new members is the highlight of each daily session. For anyone interested in membership and willing to provide contact information, their information will be directed to the appropriate chapter registrar or president for further follow-up.

Another highlight this month is the annual Medal of Honor Parade in Gainesville on Saturday, September 25th. The mile-long parade begins at 10:00 a.m. Unfortunately, we will not be taking our chapter trailer but the opportunity to walk the mile-long parade route, represent the SAR, and HONOR our Medal of Honor attendees is well-worth the effort and the trip. I hope some of you will consider joining me.

The Genealogist General has issued new guidelines to State Registrars, and thus to Chapter Registrars, on reviewing and signing off on new and supplemental applications. Currently, the application backlog is 8 1/2 weeks for new applications and 33 1/2 weeks for supplementals. In addition, the Texas Society BOM voted this past month that ALL applications must be reviewed and signed off by the Chapter Registrar before it can be sent to the State Registrar. Even though Texas, and especially our chapter, had been following this unofficially, it is now a mandatory requirement. Applications submitted that do not follow the proper chain of review will be returned to the applicant without any action taken. Please contact one of the Registrars for further information.

He married Anne Barbara Mason in 1783 in Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania.

Robert Perry Bartholow, Jr.'s application was approved on June 11th. His membership is based on his 5th great-grandfather Boaz Fleming, who served as a private in Delaware. He was born 3 Jan 1758 in Kent County, Delaware, and died 10 Oct 1854 in Marion County, Virginia. He married Elizabeth Hutchinson about 1785 in Delaware.

SEPTEMBER MEETING PROGRAM


Color Guard Commander Bobby Gresham plans to do a program on the Color Guard at our September meeting.


ALL MEMBERS OF THE CHAPTER COLOR GUARD ARE ASKED TO WEAR YOUR UNIFORM TO THE MEETING.

THE REVOLUTION'S LAST MEN





The Stories of the Final Six Surviving Soldiers Who Fought in the American Revolution

During the Civil War that threatened to tear the United States apart came the realization that only a handful of veterans of the American Revolution still survived—men who had fought the war that created the nation.


Six of these men were photographed and interviewed for a book by Reverend E. B. Hillard that appeared late in 1864. Their images have captivated generations since then; but—through a combination of faded memories and the interviewer's patriotic agenda—the biographies accompanying these amazing photographs were garbled and distorted, containing information that ranged from inaccurate to implausible. Now for the first time the military careers of these men have been researched in detail using a wide range of primary sources. The result is a new perspective on the actual service of these soldiers, from enlistment to discharge, along with new details of their relatively quiet postwar lives. The Revolution's Last Men presents the original biographical interviews published in 1864, pension depositions and other first-hand accounts given by each man later in life, and an up-to-date biography examining each soldier's service and discussing the inaccuracies and uncertainties of the previously published accounts. To complement the photographs taken in 1864, original drawings depict the men as they may have appeared when they were soldiers, using current research on military artifacts and material culture. Also included are

additional photographs of some of the men that were not part of the 1864 collection but taken when their status as the last known survivors of the American Revolution made them celebrities. While the photographs of these aged veterans continue to inspire, this book puts their service into perspective and allows these men to be appreciated for who they really were and for their great and unique service to their country.



BROTHERS AT ARMS

By Larrie D. Ferreiro



The remarkable untold story of how the American Revolution's success depended on substantial military assistance provided by France and Spain, and places the Revolution in the context of the global strategic interests of those nations in their fight against England.

In this groundbreaking, revisionist history, Larrie Ferreiro shows that at the time the first shots were fired at Lexington and Concord the colonists had little chance, if any, of militarily defeating the British. The nascent American nation had no navy, little in the way of artillery, and a militia bereft even of gunpowder. In his detailed accounts Ferreiro shows that without the extensive military and financial support of the French and Spanish, the American cause would never have succeeded. France and Spain provided close to the equivalent of \$30 billion and 90 percent of all guns used by the Americans, and they sent soldiers and sailors by the thousands to fight and die alongside the Americans, as well as around the world.

Ferreiro adds to the historical records the names of French and Spanish diplomats, merchants, soldiers, and sailors whose contribution is at last given recognition. Instead of viewing the American Revolution in isolation, *Brothers at Arms* reveals the birth of the American nation as the centerpiece of an international coalition fighting against a common enemy.

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITY FOR THE STATE FAIR OF TEXAS

Each year during the State Fair of Texas,



SAR members of North Texas Chapters conduct a major recruitment effort by manning a membership table in the Continental DAR House. The members of Jane Douglas Chapter NSDAR are the conservators of The Continental DAR House, which was built in 1936 by the Continental Oil Company and is open to visitors every day during the State Fair of Texas. The Jane Douglas Chapter, established in 1895, is the second oldest chapter in Texas.



Duties include greeting the public, talking about the SAR and how to join, answering any questions visitors might have, and obtaining contact information for those who are interested in becoming SAR members.

Two volunteers (preferably in uniform) are needed for morning and afternoon shifts beginning on Friday, September 24, 2021, and ending on Sunday, October 17, 2021. The morning shift is from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. each day, and the afternoon shift is from 2:00 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. each day. Volunteers who sign up for a minimum of three (3) shifts can obtain a pass for free parking.

General Orientation and pass pick up is currently scheduled for September 18, 2021, from 3:00 pm to 4:00 pm at the Continental DAR House at Fair Park.




VALLEY FORGE

The speaker for the August meeting was chapter member Don Woodworth, who gave a presentation on Valley Forge.

"From December 19, 1777 to June 19, 1778 General Washington and his Continentals camped at Valley Forge during their second winter. The Army built some 2000 wooden huts on the 3000 acres of the encampment, in addition to stables, hospitals, and storage facilities. They completely denuded the area of trees, and became the 4th largest city in the colonies, only behind Philadelphia, New York, and Boston. When they arrived at Valley Forge they were ill-trained amateurs, but under the proper leadership that winter they became trained professional soldiers."

Don and his family visited Valley Forge in July and presented a power point slide show of photos they took at Valley Forge.
