- Special Award: President Kinsey presented Donald Babbs with the SAR Flag Certificate.






Mark McCraw, VP Programs, introduced this month's speaker Mr. Ronnie D. Foster. Mr. Foster is a Collin County author and songwriter. His presentation highlighted his experiences before and



during his U.S. Marine Corp service in Vietnam as documented in his book "One Day as a Lion". The book tells the stories of 21 Collin County soldiers who served in the Vietnam War and never came home. Foster writes not only about their time in the war, but also gives an idea of who they were before. "My main reason for writing the book is because of my buddy Bill Bryan," Foster said. Really there wasn't a lot to tell because they died so young. They grew up, went to high school, joined the military and that



was it. I didn't want to just tell their war stories but a little bit about who they were before." R.D. shared some of his own experiences in Vietnam through photos he took. Ronnie's wife Trina managed the photo presentation. Below are some of the photos presented during the presentation.



























Corporal Charles W. "Bill" Bryan, USMC

The President of the United States of America takes pride in presenting the Navy Cross (Posthumously) to Corporal Charles William Bryan (MCSN: 2307311), United States Marine Corps, for extraordinary heroism while serving as a Patrol Leader with Company B, Third Reconnaissance Battalion, THIRD Marine Division (Reinforced), Fleet Marine Force, in connection with operations against insurgent communist (Viet Cong) forces in the Republic of Vietnam. On 20 January 1968, a seven man reconnaissance patrol led by Corporal Bryan was maneuvering with an infantry company toward Hill 881 North near the Khe Sanh Combat Base. The patrol was assigned to detach itself from the unit inconspicuously and reconnoiter the terrain surrounding Hill 881 North. In addition, Corporal Bryan was instructed to abort the mission and withdraw if the infantry unit became engaged with the enemy. As the unit approached the designated area, the Marines suddenly came under intense hostile small arms and automatic weapons fire, sustaining several cassalites. Reacting instantly, Corporal Bryan deployed his men to establish an emergency helicopter landing zone to evacuate the wounded men. Subsequently, the infantry unit was directed to attack the hostile emplacements, and realizing the unit was greatly depleted by casualties, Corporal Bryan requested permission from his unit to reinforce the infantry company with his patrol. Quickly integrating his men with an infantry squad, he was assigned as Squad Leader and skillfully maneuvered his unit toward its assigned objective. Upon approaching the designated area, the Marines began receiving intense fire from an enemy machine gan position. Undaunted by the hostile fire, he maneuvered his men around the flank of the emplacement and launched an aggressive attack which silenced the position. Alertly observing one of his men fall wounded in an
