### Meeting conducted via Zoom® teleconference

### Call to Order

David Kinsey, Chapter President, called the meeting to order at 7:04 pm.

### Program

Mark McCraw, VP of Programs introduced our speaker Joe Hardesty, Genealogical Research Library Director, National Sons of the American Revolution. Joe spoke on the National SAR Genealogical Research Library. He explained the powerful online genealogical research available through the National SAR. Joe used the SAR website in his presentation, showing how to access a wealth of genealogical information that the library has.

Joe started his presentation by discussing how he got started by in genealogy long before Internet genealogy was available. Like many of us he spent countless hours staring at microfilm. He pursued a master's degree in education and was then hired by the Louisville Free Library



working in the Genealogy department. He worked in that position for about 24 years and then came to the SAR. He has been at the SAR for three years. The Assistant Director of the library is Bryan Christian.

The library is a complete city block long. The view of the library is shown to the right. The left side of the first floor along with part of the right side is dedicated to family genealogies. There are about 12,000 family genealogies. The rest of the first floor right side is dedicated to colonial





and Revolutionary War history including key figures during that time period.





The entire second floor is dedicated to the States Collection. If for example looking at the Connecticut section, books on towns, churches and other genealogy related topics are included.

Joe then discussed the online resources available. Entering the National SAR website, Joe first selected the Genealogy tab and then the Genealogy Copy Service from the drop down directory with the resulting screen shown in the photo below.

#### Online Record Copy System

National Society Sons of the American Revolution is proud to announce the completion of its Online Record Copy System. Using this system will allow faster turnaround times, the ability to pay by credit card and a better overall experience when purchasing record copies. Please note, that you must know the Name, National Number, and Patriot to use this system. This system cannot be used for an Ancestor Search, or a Documentation Request. Those may become available at a later date.

Most copies will be returned by email the same business day the order is placed. Please keep in mind that holidays, vacation, and sick days may delay the processing of all Record Copy Requests, including those that are placed using the online system.

Additionally, record copies of living members are restricted to active members of SAR, DAR, and CAR. You must enter your National Number in the appropriate field when ordering.



Ralph submitted two deposits in testing the service, which resulted in a deposit of \$30.00 and a fee of \$1.22. The current balance in the account is \$2,820.59.
