26 minute presentation – Serves mainly 10 counties including Collin, Cook, Grayson, Hunt, Fannin, Tarrant, Dallas, Denton, Rockwall, Kaufman, 300,000 veterans in area. Mainly Grant funded from cities and state, and Golf tournament fundraiser.





Brief description of an event involving Officer Golden was read by Luis Juarez in which a suicide subject armed with a machete was in a car with relatives nearing a





school that was about to be released for the school day. Officer Golden used his training to initiate the stop and prevent and possible further escalation. Officer Golden thanked the SAR for the recognition. Supervisor Lt. Randall Meyers, McKinney Police Dept., also commented on Officer Golden's actions.







- Tom Milson, Chapter President presented Nathan White a Certificate of Appreciation for recognition of outstanding service as the Chairman of the Audit Committee, signed by TX SAR President Drake Peddie and chapter secretary. Tom expressed his gratitude for Nathan's contributions to the SAR at the national and state levels and especially to the McKinney Chapter.

- Comments from Texas Society officers:

Ted Wilson, VP District 11, asked if any members who are veterans who have not received the SAR medal for military service, and if so to let Tom Milson know. Ted stated the Edmund Terrell chapter will join the McKinney Chapter to participate in the McKinney 4th of July parade to be held on July 3rd. Paper work will be submitted to have entry into the parade. Regarding Yearly report to Nationals for points for chapter, let Tom Milson know if SAR members attend events such as SAR events, veteran funerals, related events. We don't know unless you tell us. Ted had several handouts listing a number of upcoming events, Mentorship program, Color Guard





vendors to buy uniforms and related items. Also, State SAR may be forming its own Color Guard which will require matching uniforms and required training.

David Kinsey, TX Society State Treasurer, states reconciliation for dues is almost complete. Still waiting on dues from several chapter members. David brought a revolutionary war style drum which can be used for the chapter Color Guard. If you buy a uniform and plan to fire a musket, don't buy polyester, need to buy cotton or wool.
