- Minutes from last meeting have been published on the website by David Kinsey. Pete McIellan made a motion to accept the meeting minutes, motion seconded by Ralph Thompson, no discussion, motion approved by voice vote.
- Treasurer's Report: Ralph Thompson, Treasurer read report, Year-end report, "12/31/21, The balance as of November's report was \$4771.19. We have since received \$40.00 in Dual Chapter Membership dues and \$150 for Wreaths Across America. We also received an \$11.38 direct deposit from Amazon Smiles and \$25.00 from Benevity Causes. We had an expenditure of \$41.72 for our Christmas dinner meeting and a \$150 payment to Wreaths Across America. Pete McIellan made a motion to accept the Treasures report, motion seconded by Bill Taylor, no discussion, motion approved by voice vote.


