During calendar year 2005, Robert Rankin Chapter welcomed three new members, David Jones, Alan Valle, and Dominick Valle; and one transfer member, Allan Greene. Regrettably, two compatriots, Lee Bryant and William Hall, died in 2005.

The Chapter continued its extensive involvement in youth-oriented programs. We awarded 4 bronze ROTC medals, gave out 31 Eagle Scout certificates, had 63 essays entered in the George S. and Stella M. Knight Essay Contest, solicited posters in the James Looney Poster Contest from 19 Katy ISD elementary schools, and received 250 poster entries.

The Chapter formed a Color Guard in 2005, which although modest in size, regularly posted the colors at Chapter meetings. The Color Guard and other chapter members participated in Colonial Flag Programs at over 20 schools and other organizations.

Five members of the Chapter attended the 111th Annual TXSSAR Convention in Sugar Land, March 17-19. The Chapter was recognized in several ways. Ed and Gail Raines were awarded Good Citizenship medals by the State Society for their enthusiastic and extensive involvement in

the Flag Programs. Stephanie Bishop, sponsored by Robert Rankin Chapter in the Knight Essay Contest, took third place in the state finals.

Our most important recognition was being named Outstanding Chapter for 2005 among the 30 chapters with 39 members or less. To put this into perspective, out of the 49 active chapters in Texas, we were one of 11 with entries in the poster contest, 8 with entries in the essay contest and 9 with entries in the yearbook contest.

It my pleasure to take this opportunity to thank the officers and members of Robert Rankin Chapter for their dedication and work that made 2005 the successful year that it was. My job as President was easy because of the many capable members who efficiently administered the various programs. I am confident that 2006 will be an even better year than 2005.
