Presidential Address





2021 Annual Texas State Convention

For the second year in a row, the Texas State Convention is held via Zoom. President Drake Peddie repeated his mantra of "We don't hit the pause button"! President General Jack Manning is present via Zoom, which makes this qualify as a national meeting for Color Guard recognition. All members who are in color guard via Zoom may count this.

Representing the Robert Rankin Chapter is President Michael Bierman, Immediate Past President Bruce McMordie and Tom Jackson. Bruce, a former Merchant Marine, is resplendent in his Marine green colonial uniform! Rankin Compatriot Jack Muggli, Coastal Registrar, is also present.

On Sunday of the convention, the memorial service is held for Texas Compatriots who have passed and have become members of the eternal chapter. This presentation has music and is PowerPoint based with a slide for each Compatriot.

Patriot Medal Chairman Tom Jackson prepared a multimedia salute, replete with a commendation voice over by senior Patriot Medal Holders to the 2021 Class of Patriot Medal Honorees. The six winners for 2021 include Bill Adriance (Galvez), Louis "Lou" P. Colantoni (William Hightower), William Hurst (Plano), Jack Muggli (Robert Rankin), Mel Oller (Freedom) and Larry Spradlin (Sharp).

The Robert Rankin Chapter was richly rewarded for all of the contributions from its members. The State awarded the chapter with the John K. Harrell C.A.R. Competition Award, Outstanding Chapter Award Group 2 (40-99 members), Texas Enhanced JROTC Award for sponsoring 1st Place Winner Cadet Diana Cantu, George S. & Stella M. Knight Essay and Texas SAR C.A.R. Essay 2nd Place Winner Scholarship Contests for sponsoring Victoria Smith and The Col. M. Hill Patriot Fund Award. Jack Muggli, Chris Courter & Tom Jackson received individual awards.

Robert Rankin's own Jack Muggli was selected as one of six candidates to receive the 2021 Patriot Medal. The Patriot Medal is the highest award that an SAR member may receive from the State Society. At the very first meeting Jack attended, the vacancy of the Texas Coastal Registrar was announced and Jack raised his hand and said," I Can do that!"



Since inception, he has reviewed 680 applications and transmitted 581. In so doing, he has rejected 1 out of 6 applications and returned them with instructions on the areas that need improvement. In conjunction with the 2018 National Congress, the notables project was launched. Jack embraced the concept and helped research and process applications of several notables. These included Judge Ridgeway of Houston, Brazos County Judge Edgar Peters (Bush Library recognition), and welcoming speaker Harris County Commissioner Jack Cagle. Other notables were Justice Wise of Texas Court of Appeals, Four Star General Joseph Ashy and ten expedited and approved applications. Those included six WWII combat veterans, and one who died within an hour of receiving his certificate. Jack has served as a Chapter officer, State officer, and for the last three years as State Genealogy Committee Chairman giving numerous state and chapter genealogy presentations.
