

January Meeting -This Day in History

Hugh Mercer (16 January 1726 – 12 January 1777) was a Scottish soldier and physician who participated in the Seven Years' War, became a brigadier general in the American Continental Army and was a close friend to George Washington. Mercer died as a result of his wounds received at the Battle of Princeton and became a fallen hero, as well as a rallying symbol of the American Revolution. Mercer's courage and sacrifice allowed for a series of events that would allow the American forces to rally.


Allan Perkins joined in the laying of wreaths at the Houston National Cemetery on Veterans Memorial Drive.

New Members: Jim Wise & Justice Ken Wise



Jim P. Wise was appointed to the UH System Board of Regents in 2006 by Governor Rick Perry and served through August 31, 2011. He served on the Search Committee that recommended Dr. Renu Khator, served as vice chair of the Board of Regents twice, secretary once, member of the Executive Committee, chaired the Finance Committee. He also served on the Facilities Committee, Construction Committee, Endowment Committee, Audit Committee, and Strategic Planning Committee.

Wise is a managing member of Haddington Energy Partners III, and Haddington Energy Partners IV, with over 45 years of business experience with several public companies.

A native Houstonian and fourth generation Texan, Jim is a member of many civic and professional organizations, among them Life Member of the Houston Metropolitan Area Advisory Board of the Salvation Army of Houston, and serves on the board of several corporations.





Justice Ken Wise sits on the 14th Court of Appeals in Houston. He previously served as Judge of both the 334th and 152nd District Courts in Harris County. He is a member of the Texas Judicial Council and a director of the Judicial Section of the State Bar of Texas. He is an adjunct professor at Houston Baptist University and a former adjunct professor at the University of Houston Law Center. He is the creator and host of the award-winning Texas history podcast "Wise About Texas." Justice Wise has published numerous journal articles and is a regular speaker on Texas history across the State of Texas. In 2021 Justice Wise was honored by the Texas House of Representatives for his contributions in preserving Texas history.
