

Gus was a Cub Scout Master for three years when he lived in South Texas and is a recipient of the Scouters Key. He is a Past Grand Knight of Houston Council 803, Knights of Columbus.

**Educational:** Graduate of St. Thomas High School in Houston, and The Agricultural and Mechanical College of Texas, Class of 1950, B.S. in Petroleum Engineering.

**Professional:** Distinguished Member and Legion of Honor Member, Society of Petroleum Engineers. Registered Professional Engineer in Texas, Louisiana, Colorado, and Georgia. Retired from Conoco in 1994. Historical/Genealogical: Dual Member of Robert Rankin Chapter 62 and Alexander Hodge Chapter 49. Present at the Battle of Manchac (aka Ft. Bute). Listed as one of the "Original Spanish Settlers" of the Attakapas District, Southwest Louisiana. He raised cattle after the War.
