Theron and Olga McLaren

The Lady Washington Chapter, DAR honored Captain Theron McLaren & his wife Olga for their Vietnam Era service to coincide with the National DAR Day of Service at Houston's Woodlawn Cemetery, (aka Little Arlington). Over 100 individuals were in attendance for the cemetery and headstone cleanup project and included representatives of the SAR, General Society War of 1812, scouts, girl scouts and DAR members. Theron, a Rankin Compatriot, joined the DAR in 2009 while Olga, a Lady Washington member, joined the DAR in 1958. She has been highly supportive of the SAR throughout. Subsequently, the Rankin Chapter recognized their service. The Lady Washington Chapter is the world's largest DAR chapter and membership base approximates the size of the SAR in Texas. The presentation was made by Regent Mary Anthony Starz.

Theron and Olga spent 2 years during the Vietnam Era, from 1960-1962, on the island of Crete, Greece as one of 40 U.S. Air Force Officers at Iraklion Air Force Base (Iraklion Air Station). The mission of the Base was to monitor the radio traffic of the Russian Bloc. The base personnel were the first to announce the catcher of Francis Gary Powers. Francis Gary Powers was piloting a U-2 spy plane at 70,000 feet when he lost power, descended and was shot down and captured.

The first TV station equipment arrived at Athens Air Force Base in 1960. The Greek government did not want the 1st TV station to be on an American Base and accordingly, the equipment was sent to Crete. Olga was the Speech and Debate school teacher in Crete, and she was invited to help in the television programing and she hosted a generic talk show with items of interest.

Upon their arrival, there weren't sufficient housing trailers, so for 2 months they lived "on the economy" as they called it, as they rented an apartment above a family home. They made friends with the family and went to into the community with them where they learned about the Greek culture, lifestyle and even a little of the Greek language. Then, as part of the deal, they lived on base before acquiring their very own 40-foot trailer for the remainder of their stay.
