



TXSSAR Silver Galvez Medals

For the sixth year in a row, the Historian for Robert Rankin has been honored as having submitted an Outstanding Yearbook in its size category for Texas. This year, Tom Jackson and Stephen Tanner submitted a remarkable yearbook and received accolades for creativity and organization. The chapter yearbook takes between 100 and 200 hours to compile. Both Compatriots were awarded the prestigous Texas SAR Silver Galvez Medals.

For the second time in Chapter history, the E.A. Limmer award in group two (membership between twenty-six and thirty-nine) was given to the Rankin Chapter. This award is given to the chapter that has the highest percentage of approved supplemental awards. This award was earned largely upon supplementals submitted by Tom and Ash Jackson.

Children of the American Revolution

There are three different types of recognitions available encourage to participation with the CAR. The first is participation in the CAR Essay Contest. The Rankin Chapter did not field an entry this year. This broke a string of five consecutive years of having a Chapter submission noted at the state level. All was not lost as the Chapter hit pay dirt in two other areas.

The Chapter received for the third year in a row the The John K. Harrell CAR Activities Award, named for Compatriot Harrell of the San Antonio Chapter, and intended to recognize those chapters which support strong relationships between the SAR and the Children of the American Revolution.

The Chapter also won the John K. Harrell CAR Competition Award for the third straight year and received a monetary award of \$50. Other Awards

The Chapter was also awarded the NSSAR Center for Advancing America's Heritage Capital Campaign based upon a Chapter Contribution to the national fund. The Chapter contributed \$500.

For the third time in the history of the chapter, Rankin was awarded the Colonel Joe M. Hill Patriot Fund Award. This award is given to those chapters which increase the contribution to the Patriots Fund over the amount given the prior year.

The Chapter received the Flag Furling award and for the sixth year in a row led the state in the issuance of flag certificates! **Theron McLaren** is the Committee Chairman and has led this amazing effort with help from Steve Tanner, Ed Raines, and Tom Jackson.

Raymond Cox Web Master, TXSSAR, Robert Rankin Member, Robert Rankin Chapter



Personal:

Raymond (Ray) Webster Cox was born October, 1947 in Silver City, New Mexico to Charles M. Cox and Ellen Jane (Logan) Cox. The Cox family moved to Biloxi, MS in 1952, where Ray grew up and attended school until his graduation from Biloxi High School.

Ray is married to Martha Marie (Wilson) Cox and has two children: Jennifer Lynne (Cox) Halling, and Kenneth Edwin Cox. Kenneth is a member of the SAR. Ray and Martha have five grand-children: Thomas Jeremy Halling, Jacob Logan Halling, Kaleb Logan Cox, Lenzi Grace Halling, and Kylah Grace Cox.

Educational:

Ray attended the Univ. of Southern Mississippi and received a double degree in Music Education and Applied Music. His performance major was French Horn, but between high school and college, he has played all of the lower brass instruments as well as alto and tenor saxophone. The saxophones were played in the high school stage band and a rock and roll band.

Military and Professional:

While in college, Ray enlisted in the US Navy AVROC program and after graduation he was commissioned as an officer in the Navy. After flight training he was assigned to Reconnaissance Attack Wing One flying the RA-5C Vigilante. He made deployments on the USS Independence and the USS Nimitz (maiden voyage). After 8 ½ years of military service, Ray separated from the Navy and flew for Continental Airlines for two years until being furloughed. He then went to work for the FAA

as an Air Traffic Controller, from which he recently retired with over 21 years of service.

Genealogical:

Ray joined the Robert Rankin Chapter when he became District VIII Vice President in 2007 and has remained a proud member. Ray is a primary member of the Piney Woods Chapter where he has served as Secretary, first VP, President, and Sgt. at Arms and he served as Editor for the Chapter's Lineage Book Vol. 2.

At the State level, Ray is the Web Master and was recognized for having the most outstanding state website! He has served on the Long Range Planning, State Meeting, Color Guard, and Information Technology committees. He has just finished serving a term as the president of the Council of Chapter Presidents. He has served as editor in producing the TXSSAR History Book Volumes I & II text and CDs.

In 2008, Ray was awarded the Patriot's medal! In 2011, Ray received the State Medal of Distinguished Service and in 2010, he received the Chapter Distinguished Service Medal.

Ray was co-planner of the Zachariah Landrum and Henry Bailey Greenwood grave marking ceremonies and has received the Bronze Good Citizenship, War Service, Meritorious Service, Color guard, Baron von Steuben, and TXSSAR Chapter Service Medals and is a George Washington Fellow. He is the author of the SARApAid computer application program, which is the leading application program in use by the members of the NSSAR.

Ray's Patriot Ancestor is James Taylor from Ireland. Patriot Taylor emigrated from Ireland and settled in Virginia. He served as a private in Capt. Joseph Smith's Co. of the VA 4th during the revolution. James Taylor died in Rockbridge Co, VA, which is noteworthy because there is a natural bridge in that county that bears George Washington's signature which he placed there while he was surveying the area as a young man before his public career.
