## Our May Meeting

On August 4, 2010, miners were at work in the San Jose gold and copper mine situated in the Atacama Desert of northern Chile about twenty-eight miles north of Copiapó. The next day, a minor earthquake struck the region causing a tunnel collapse and trapped 33 miners underground. They were believed to be between 500 and 800 meters (1640' to 2300') below the surface. The complexities were enormous. Local drilling equipment could reach a depth of 400 meters, food and water for the miners would not be adequate, and the structure through which drilling was required was rock hard enough it caused the drilling bit to move.

Greg Hall, owner of Drillers Supply International, was contacted directly by a representative of the Chilean government after problems were encountered with the initial operations. Thus began the rescue operation known as Plan B.

The best estimate was that the miners had perhaps five days of food and water. After fifteen days of drilling Hall noted that, the mood had become more somber as most thought they were conducting a recovery operation instead of a rescue. On day 17, the drill entered a void and soon there was beating on the pipe, meaning at least one person lived. The operation was eventually concluded after sixty-nine days with all of the miners saved!
