Our Veterans' Day Celebration

Our Veterans' Day Speaker was John E. McKemie, Colonel (Ret.). His stirring presentation was in three parts. The first included excerpts from Veteran's Day Speeches by Presidents of our country. The middle part of his presentation recounted the retreat by George Washington from the Battle of New York. Interesting points included the amazing escape by Washington with most of his army intact despite overwhelming superiority in British numbers, the toppling of a statue of King George prior to the battle and the hanging of Nathan Hale after the battle. The third part of his presentation was an audio visual slide show accompanied by the music entitled *The American Soldier* by Toby Keith.
