
Shown above is Colonel Mike Mastrangelo with 30 years active duty time and a graduate of the ROTC program from the University of Dayton, OH. He has a Master's Degree in American History, taught as an adjunct professor for two colleges, and has been a substitute teacher for the KISD system for three years. Col. Mike, Senior Vice Commander of Katy VFW, provided the second part of our program and spoke passionately of the meaning of the Constitution to a group involving SAR members and its importance to our country. The third part of our Celebration of the Constitution was recognition of educators who have excelled in this area. The two teachers we honored, Dianne Sparks and Marilyn Chevalier embraced the "We the People" program and made it part of their schools curriculum. Ms. Sparks was unable to attend because it was Open House at her school! Each teacher received a Bronze Good Citizenship Medal with Certificate as well as a Flag Certificate for their schools.

We the People is a National Endowment for the Humanities program designed to encourage and enhance the teaching, study, and understanding of American history, culture, and democratic principles. President George Bush officially launced We The People on Constitution Day 2002.

Our Compatriot Ed Raines has been invited to serve as a moderator at both schools. Their classes go through the entire Election Process with candidates, primaries, conventions, speeches, debates, inc. and finally voting, with an inauguration ceremony in January.

"On the 23rd instant, at 50'clock in the evening, the question was put that the Convention assent to and ratify the Federal Constitution for the United States of America upon which the votes stood as follows: For the Ratification 149, Against 73, Majority 76."
