Any member is welcome to show up at the same time. It won't take long but want this induction to be memorable to the inductee.

A Touch of Denton Chapter History

Chapter Member Jim Johnson, the keeper of all things involving Denton Chapter history, came across an old February 1998 Chapter newsletter which provides a little chapter history. In 1995 the Denton chapter went through reorganization (probably similar to our situation today) and a copy of an old February 1998 newsletter gives us a clue on that time period. In January 1998, Jack Haughton, Texas SAR State secretary, spoke at the funeral of Richard Fletcher. Haughton mentioned that he helped in a **reorganization of the Denton chapter in 1995** and the first new member was Richard Earl Fletcher who became the first chapter president after this 1995 reorganization. Fletcher was instrumental in getting the chapter up and running again. Fletcher is interred at Roselawn Cemetery, Denton, Texas. We continue to search for more information on the Denton Chapter, especially from its original inception in 1965.



One evening in September I presented the Vietnam War Era lapel pin to former Navy pilot Norm Leggett (r), a neighbor of mine at Robson Ranch. He has some hair-raising stories to tell about his time in Vietnam as a member of a "downed pilot rescue" unit. At the October meeting, I will explain how our chapter members will be able to present this lapel pin to military veterans you know who served on active duty during the time-frame of the Vietnam War.

THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION TIMELINE – "THIS DATE IN HISTORY"

- October 8, 1775 In Cambridge, Washington's general officers met at a Council of War and agreed that the new Army consist of at least 20, 372 men enlisted for a oneyear term.
- October 1, 1776 American's occupy the three strong points in New York; Harlem Heights, Kings Bridge and Mt. Washington.
- October 4, 1776 John Adams writing his wife observed the new government emerging; "we live in an age of political experiments. Among many that will fail, some I hope will succeed."

- October 4, 1780 Battle of Kings Mountain, S.C. Major Patrick Ferguson and his 1,100 loyalists are either killed, captured or wounded in the battle with 1400 frontiersmen. The battle forces Cornwallis to abandon his invasion of North Carolina.
- October 19, 1781 Lord Cornwallis surrenders at Yorktown, VA and over 7000 British soldiers march off into captivity. The British are unable to marshal another army in America and this virtually ensures American independence, although it takes another year to sign a peace treaty
