#### THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION TIMELINE – "THIS DATE IN HISTORY"

April 5, 1763 The Sugar Act was passed by Britain's Parliament and read in part "expedient that new provisions and regulations should be established for improving the revenue of the Kingdom... (this did not sit well with the Colonists and was part of the beginning of the end for Colonial rule)

April 19, 1775 The first shots are fired at Lexington and Concord in Massachusetts. The news spread of the bloodshed and thousands of citizens began to converge on Cambridge, Mass. Both armies were unmoving during most of April.

April 27, 1777 Benedict Arnolds' troops forced a British retreat at Ridgefield, Connecticut.
