


Scots-Irish and Presbyterians, Focus of New Books.

If you have Irish or Scots-Irish ancestors, three books new to the Emily Fowler Public Library shelves will provide context, resources, and strategies to boost your genealogical research.



Transatlantic Lives: The Irish Experience in Colonial America (2019), edited by Linda Lunney, William Roulston, and James Quinn, features 59 essays chosen from the Royal Irish Academy's Dictionary of Irish Biography, detailing the careers of dozens of Irish emigrants to North America during the colonial period. Colonial administrators, soldiers and clergymen are featured, but educators, doctors, artists, merchants, and even a female pirate are profiled as well. Though Presbyterian clergy are most featured in that category, Anglican, Methodist, and Catholic clergy are also included to show how they, too, shaped the religious culture of the colonies.





Widely recognized as the preeminent textbook for Scots-Irish genealogy research, the second edition of *Researching Scots-Irish Ancestors* (2022) by William J. Roulston, includes additional information on church records and landed estate papers, as well as new chapters on records related to law and order, emigration, business and occupations, diaries and journals, and clubs and societies.

The two-section work covers: Sources for Scots-Irish ancestry, their significance, and where they may be found, including: Church records and gravestone inscriptions 17th- and 18-century records Landed estate papers and Registry of Deeds records Inheritance, legal, and election records Military sources Newspaper and books, as well as diaries, journals, and memoirs Business and occupational sources Clubs and society records And many more. Info on 350+ estate collections with relevant material from the pre-1800 period.

Finally, beginning with an introduction to the "many shades of Presbyterianism," *Researching Presbyterian Ancestors In Ireland* (2022) by William J. Roulston, focuses on congregations, records, registers of baptisms & marriages, records of higher courts and other Presbyterian bodies, ministers, places of worship and burial, Presbyterian publications, education, other sources of info on Presbyterians, etc. It concludes with research suggestions, a bibliography and a listing of libraries and archives of interest.

All titles are available in Special Collections at the Emily Fowler Central Library.
