

While we are on the subject, the 2024 Annual SAR National Conference will be held in San Antonio from April 11 to April 14, 2024. This is a good deal for those of us from Denton because it is only about a four and a half hour drive. In recent years, this conference was held in Orlando, Florida and Savannah, Georgia. Besides, April is always a good time to be in San Antonio. Registration is not open as of the writing of this message, but keep checking the same "Events" tab, and click on "Upcoming Meetings," or just keep watching our Chapter Newsletter.

The Texas SAR Website is also the place where you can easily pay your 2024 dues. Again, click on "Events," and then "Online Dues/ Donation Payments."

The Denton FIVE MEMBER Color Guard provided the Posting of the Colors for the Benjamin Lyon Chapter (Denton) of the Daughters of the American Revolution on September 15, for the "Ringing of the Bells" ceremony. This ceremony commemorates the church bells that rang out when 39 members of the Constitutional Convention signed the Constitution on September 17, 1787 at Independence Hall in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Compatriot David Cook and the other members of the Color Guard have fully engaged Color Guard activities, and I think we can designate it a success. This time a year ago, we had to refer Color Guard requests to the American Legion because we did not have a functioning Color Guard.

The Chapter is working on a couple of events that you may be interested in. First, we have acquired a copy of Volumes Two and Three of the book "Proud Heritage, Pioneer Families of Dallas County," The Denton Public Library already has Volume One, and we are coordinating an appropriate donation ceremony, hopefully at our next meeting on October 14. Thanks to Compatriot David Cook, we have a framed 33 inch by 27 inch copy of the Constitution that we would like to donate to the Denton County Courthouse. If you have not been to this new courthouse at 1 Courthouse Drive, Denton, I encourage you to stay tuned for the day and time of this donation. This courthouse is magnificent, and we hope that the framed copy of the Constitution will only enhance the decorum of the courthouse. Both of these planned events are examples of things that we at the Denton Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution do for the community.

The Denton Chapter will also schedule a flag retirement ceremony for sometime in the early fall. This ceremony oversees the respectful burning of United States flags that are torn, tattered, dirty, or otherwise not serviceable. The current plan is to enlist the help of the Denton Fire Department to conduct this ceremony. With that in mind, please gather your (and your neighbors) old and unserviceable flags for this ceremony, and bring it to our next meeting. 50th Anniversary Vietnam War Commemoration Lapel Pin Project

Like the Denton chapter, many other chapters within the Texas Society of the Sons of the American Revolution participate in this very worthy project. One is our neighbor chapter to the South, the Major K M Van Zandt Chapter in Fort Worth, Texas. The Van Zandt chapter has been involved for about 7-8 years with the program scheduled to end in about two more years.

David Fleming, a member of the K M Van Zandt Chapter, is a Lieutenant with the Fort Worth Police Department and he has been in the chapter for the past 4 years. Below is his story about a lapel pin that he presented to Vietnam veteran in late September 2023.

Fleming wrote, "On September 26, 2023, I had the privilege of having lunch with Sergeant "Izzy Espinoza" of the Fort Worth Police Department.

Sgt. Espinoza is a veteran of the U.S. Air Force and served as a navigator on the B-52 Stratofortress bomber during the 1970s. He was stationed at Carswell Air Force Base (now called Joint Reserve Base) and after separating from the USAF he stayed on in Fort Worth and joined the FWPD. He was hired in November 1982 and is currently in his 40th year carrying a badge for the City of Fort Worth. I presented Sgt. Espinoza with a Commemorative Lapel pin as well as the Major K M Van Zandt chapter challenge coin. I thanked him for his service to our Country and ensured him his contribution




would never be forgotten.


