

The Texas SAR has approved the additional award of \$500 for second place Teacher of the Year Essays.

The Fall Board of Mangers (BOM) meeting was held at College Station, Texas during the weekend of October 22 to 24, 2023. The highlights of the meetings included an announcement that two new SAR chapters were have been formed, one in San Angelo, and one in Ellis County. That brings the number of Texas SAR chapters to 50!

#### **Chapter President's Message, continued**

The University of North Texas (UNT) Library will no longer be the "host" for the Texas Sons of the American Revolution Archives. UNT is withdrawing from this project, not only for the Texas SAR, but for several other organizations. It is my understanding that this is a space, or personnel issue for UNT. Instead, the Texas SAR will keep the archives in digital form, and will be housed on a server that will be maintained by the Texas SAR. This means that our archived material, such as newsletters, chapter minutes, and by-laws will have to be forwarded in digital form, instead of as documents.

Last month, I announced in this president's message that the 2024 Annual SAR National Conference will be held in San Antonio from April 11 to April 14, 2024. That is not correct. The Texas SAR Conference will be held in San Antonio on those dates. We apparently lost this bid for the national Congress to another state. No matter what conference is held in San Antonio in April, San Antonio is always a good city in which to spend a weekend. Please consider marking your calendar to attend.

The Denton Chapter is still planning to schedule a flag retirement ceremony. This ceremony oversees the respectful burning or destruction of United States flags that are torn, tattered, dirty, or otherwise not serviceable. If your flag is currently being displayed outside ot Ancestor has been approved at the SAR Nayour home, maybe it's time to replace it with a new, clean flag. Please let me know if you have retired a flag, and we can include that flag in this ceremony.

Denton Color Guard Commander David Cook has posted future opportunities for the chapter color guard in this months newsletter. These events start on Saturday, November 4, 2023, and include events through the middle of December—so far.

In addition to those events in David's newsletter, several other Veterans Day events will be held. Veterans Day will be observed on Friday, November 10, 2023 at 12:00 noon on the Downton Denton Square, 110 West Hickory Street, Denton.

On Saturday, Nov 11, 2023 from 5:00 pm to 9:00 pm the Texas Veterans Hall of Fame 5th Annual Induction Ceremony will be held at the UNT Gateway Center, 801 N. Texas Blvd, Denton. This event honors Texas Veterans for their service, and the keynote speaker will be Medal of Honor Recipient Dwight W. Birdwell. Tickets are \$55.00.

This is not a complete list of events Veterans Day events, so please send me a note about what you will be doing to recognize Veterans Day 2023. Personally, I will be joining my grandson and granddaughter for a Veterans recognition ceremony at their elementary school.

Because of our packed agenda at the last meeting, we were not able to include the biography of each of our patriot ancestors, as planned. We will endeavor to do that in our next meeting. Members and guests will have the opportunity to give a short (5 minutes, or less) biography of their Patriot Ancestor. It is significant to note that several events are designated as National Events which earns 20 points toward national and state Color Guard medals.



## TEJANO REVOLUTIONARIES: RESOURCES FOR TEJANO PATRIOTS OF THE AMERICAN AND TEXAS REVOLUTIONS


Tejano participation in the American and Texas Revolutions are the focus of two new books available in Special Collections.



*Tejano Patriots of the American Revolution, 1776–1783* (Austin: published by author, 2011), is a labor of love of author Jesse O. Villareal, Sr., who discovered that he is a 9th generation Texan whose ancestors came to Texas in expeditions in the early 1700s, and were witnesses to Texas history during the American Revolution. As a descendant of numerous Texas founding families, Villareal documented his Tejano's ancestors' vital role in winning the American Revolution, and was inducted into the Texas Society of the Sons of the American Revolution in 2008.

Villareal read, studied, and copied original and translated archival documents to outline the history of Texas during the Revolutionary War period, 1776-1783. Each chapter features a short historical background, followed by excerpts from original Bexar Archive documents, to give readers a sense of the social and historical context of the time.

Book chapters cover accounts of life in the presidios; Spanish royal military enlistments in the presidios; Texas as the "fourth front" in the Revolution; Tejanos' connections to the Revolution; Tejano ranchers, vaqueros, and residents who contributed to the war effort; and rosters of patriot Spanish soldiers from the presidios, as well as those stationed in the Province of Texas at the time. Illustrations, maps, a glossary, document images, and translations dot the book and bring the text to life. The author's nine-generation ancestral line is documented in the appendix.



JL Gonzalez's just-published book, *Tejano Volunteer Company 1835-1836: Stories of our Texas Revolution* (Coppell, Texas: Tejano Volunteer Company, 2023) tells in brief chapters the stories of the most successful militia of the Texas Revolution—the Tejano Volunteer Company.

The book is Gonzalez's effort to right a disservice. As he states in his introduction, "...Tejanos were the common thread that wove through almost all revolutionary events...many young Tejanos played key roles during the most crucial and dire situations...descendants of these brave patriots rarely hear, or have ever heard, of their ancestor's heroic, historic and courageous exploits in the fight for Texas."

The slim volume will be a quick but important read for anyone interested in learning more about the vital Tejano contributions to the Texas fight for independence.

Both books are available for in-library viewing at the Emily Fowler Central Library Special Collections area.
